"My first love has always been the magnificent white Persian and ever since he was little I knew Boodles was something special. I called him my little bulldog because he was so square and robust looking. I think it's down to his multi-national ancestors; his



father's a grand champion!

"I wasn't looking at keeping another white boy but he used to come and sit on my leg and make out I had to keep him.

"He has oodles of personality and is an amazing pet. He is such a people cat and such a comedian. Everyone who sees him just wants to touch him and he laps it up. He sits at the front of the pen at shows and draws people in."

"He sees me packing his show bag and he knows what's coming. His grooming routine takes about two hours and he loves it; it's attention after all!"

## Three-legged star


